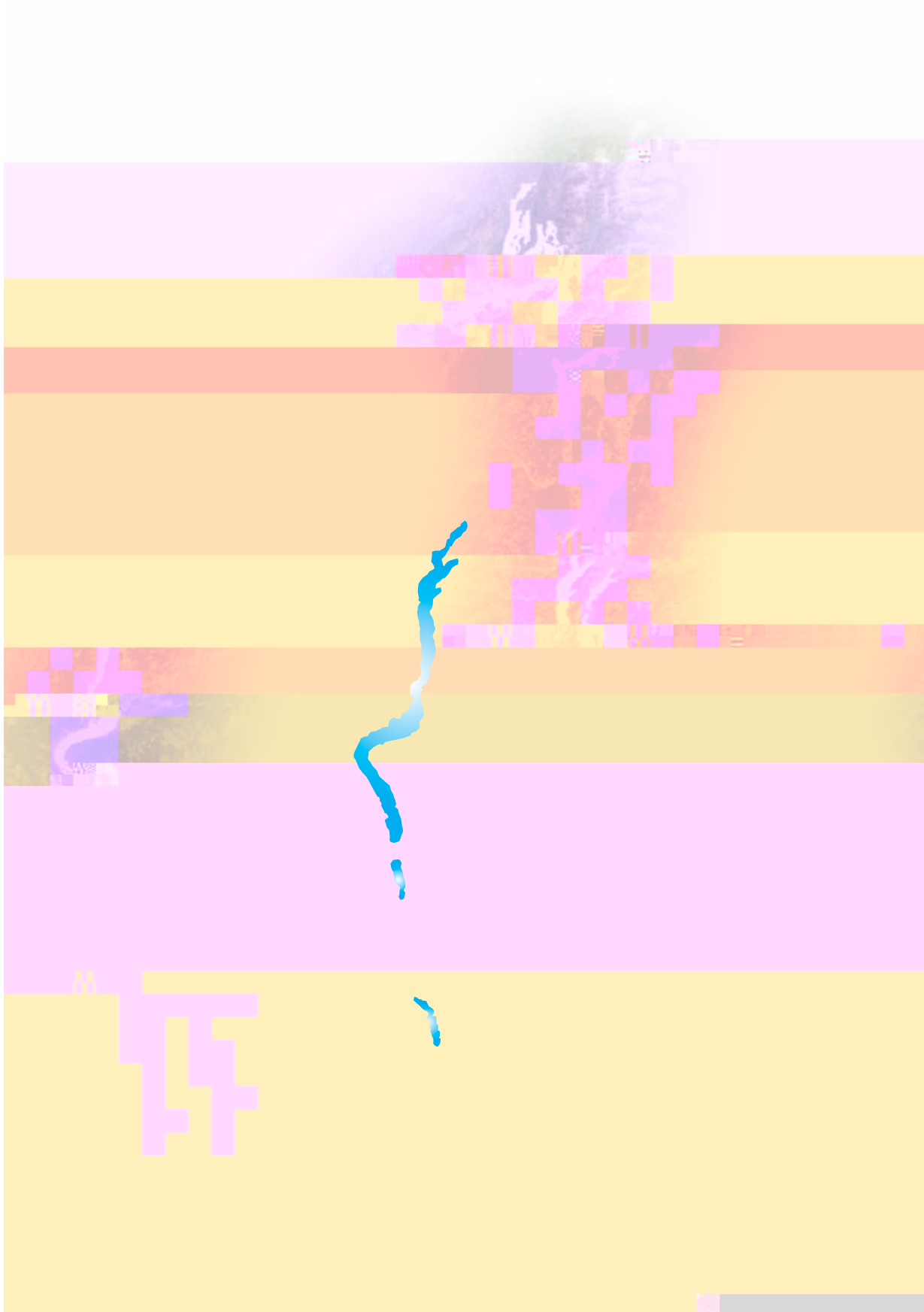

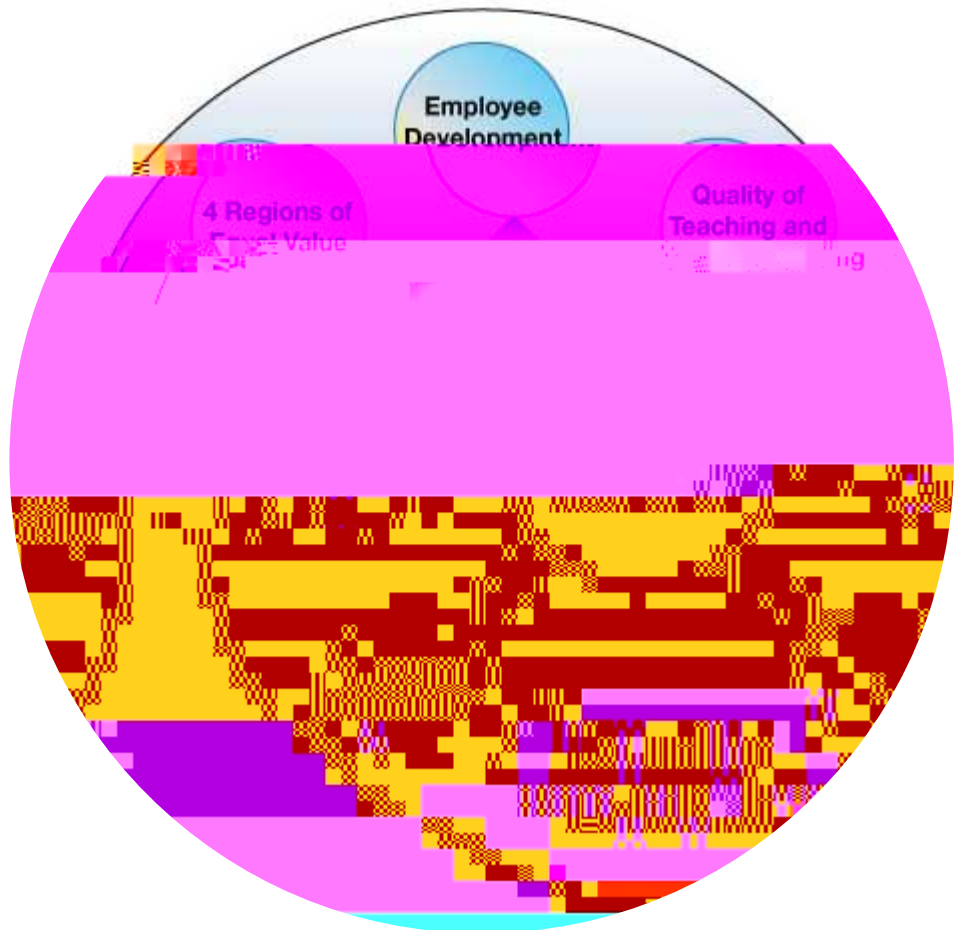

B. STUDENT SUCCESS

Number of students enrolled at Okanagan College in 2009-10 was 27,166 (2,053 in 09-10, 1,616 in 2008-09). In 2009-2010, 84% of students (93.5% in 2008-09) successfully completed their studies, compared to 79.7% in 2008-09. First-time success rates for Okanagan College students were 97.6% in 2009-10, compared to 91.8% in 2008-09. Employment rates for graduates were 93.1% in 2009-10, compared to 96.4% in 2008-09. Successful completion rates for students in Business Administration, Tourism, and Arts were 98.5%, 98.5%, and 98.5% respectively in 2009-10, compared to 98.5%, 98.5%, and 98.5% in 2008-09. 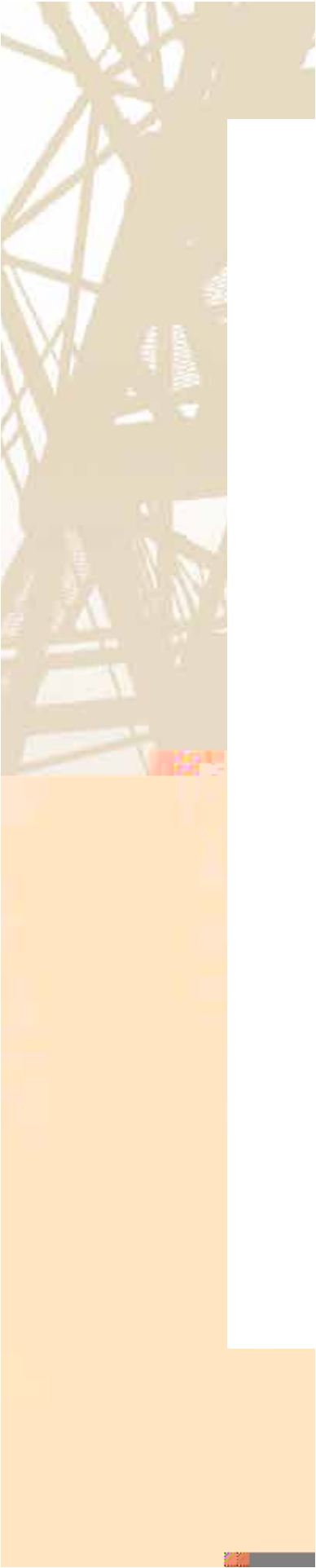
C. ABORIGINAL COMMUNITIES

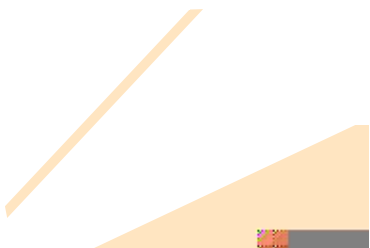
Successful completion rates for Aboriginal students at Okanagan College were 98.5% in 2009-10, compared to 98.5% in 2008-09. The MOA (Memorandum of Understanding) between Okanagan College and the First Nations of the Okanagan Valley was signed in 2009. In 2009-10, 856 Aboriginal students were enrolled at Okanagan College, compared to 513 in 2007-08. Aboriginal students at Okanagan College are supported by the Aboriginal Student Support Program (ASSP) and the Aboriginal Student Society (ASS). In 2009, the ASSP provided support to 180 Aboriginal students. The ASS provided support to 180 Aboriginal students.
